Man Extradited from Mexico to Face Trial in Adams County Murder Case

A defendant extradited from Mexico to face trial in a 2010 murder case appeared in Adams County District Court Tuesday for advisement of the arrest warrant filed against him five years ago.

Javier Aguirre (DOB 11/30/79) is charged with first-degree murder after deliberation (F1), first degree felony murder (F2) and two counts of aggravated robbery (F3) in the slaying of Lyndsay Pham on March 34, 2010 at the northwest Aurora apartment complex she owned and managed.

Pham, 45, was beaten and stabbed in the office of the Descanso Plaza Apartments at 11102 E. 16th Avenue in Aurora.

“This was a long and difficult process,” said District Attorney Dave Young. “I’m very thankful to the Mexican government and our government for their efforts in bringing this defendant back so we can proceed with the charges against him in this horrendous crime.”

Aguirre is due in court at 8:30 a.m. October 14 for formal advisement of the charges and setting of a preliminary hearing.

The filing of a criminal charge is merely a formal accusation that an individual committed a crime under Colorado laws. A defendant is presumed innocent until and unless proven guilty.
