Man Convicted of First-Degree Murder in Slaying at Crestline Motel

Joshua Thomas Bohl was convicted of first-degree murder Thursday in the November 2, 2014 slaying of his girlfriend at the Crestline Motel in unincorporated Adams County.

Jayne Hosier, 29, was found dead at the Crestline Motel at 7330 Brighton Road on November 4, 2014. Bohl (DOB 07/23/81) was charged with first degree murder (F1).

An Adams County District Court jury deliberated less than two hours before reaching the guilty verdict.

According to evidence presented in the trial that began Monday, Bohl killed Hosier on November 2, 2014, and then left her body in their apartment while he went to stay with his ex-girlfriend in Fort Lupton. He called police two days later claiming that Hosier was killed when a television set fell on her face.

The coroner concluded that Hosier died of asphyxia due to blunt force trauma to the neck.

"The defendant has a history of domestic violence that culminated in the death of Jayme Hosier," said Senior Deputy District Attorney Ally Baber. "The evidence established that he intentionally and after deliberation murdered Jayme Hosier. Nothing is going to bring the family closure but we hope this verdict brings a sense of justice for the family."

Bohl will be sentenced at 1:30 p.m. December 3 in Division F of Adams County District Court.
