Two Men Charged with First-Degree Murder in Trailer Park Shooting

17th Judicial District Attorney Dave Young announced Wednesday that first-degree murder and attempted murder charges have been filed against Rojelio Heredia and Brandon Karr in a shooting at an Adams County mobile home park on Sunday.

The charges allege that Heredia (DOB 10/21/91) and Karr (DOB 04/24/92) began shooting at each other after an altercation became physical in the Berkley Village Mobile Home Park at 5400 Sheridan Boulevard early Sunday morning. Heredia lived at the trailer park and was hosting a party. Karr arrived at the location with three other people and a confrontation began with occupants of the trailer next door to Heredia's. Shots were fired before and after Karr's group drove off.

Edgar Munoz (DOB 03-15-86) and Dustin Karr (DOB 02/05/94) died of gunshot wounds. Sergio Ontiveros-Heredia, 26, and Perla Nevarez, 24, suffered gunshot wounds.

Karr is charged with one count of first-degree extreme indifference murder, nine counts of attempted first-degree murder, two counts of first-degree assault and crime of violence, a sentencing enhancer.

Heredia is charged with one count of first-degree extreme indifference murder, three counts of attempted first-degree murder and crime of violence, a sentencing enhancer.

Both appeared in Adams County District Court on Wednesday for formal advisement of the charges. A preliminary hearing for Karr will be set at 8:30 a.m. August 18 in Division E of Adams County District Court. A preliminary hearing for Heredia will be set at 8:30 a.m. August 17. Both are held without bond.

The filing of a criminal charge is merely a formal accusation that an individual committed a crime under Colorado laws. A defendant is presumed innocent until and unless proven guilty.
