**Adrian Moya Sentenced to 32 Years for Attempted Murder of
Northglenn Officer**

Adrian Brandon Moya has been sentenced to 32 years in prison for attempted first-degree murder in the shooting of a Northglenn police officer last December.

Moya (DOB 03/06/92) shot at a Northglenn police officer multiple times during a traffic stop on December 19, 2015. Two Northglenn officers were conducting a traffic stop at the Diamond Shamrock gas station at 11195 Huron Street when they discovered that Moya had an outstanding warrant for felony menacing and forgery.

Moya, a passenger in the car, attempted to flee and shot at officers as they pursued him. The officer, who was protected by his ballistic vest, was shot twice. The officer shot back at Moya, hitting him multiple times. Moya was treated for his wounds and arrested.

Moya pleaded guilty to the charge in September as part of a plea agreement with a stipulated sentence of 20 to 32 years in prison. District Judge Katherine Delgado sentenced him to the maximum of that range at a sentencing hearing Friday in Adams County District Court.
