**Two Men Sentenced to Probation for Selling Counterfeit Broncos Merchandise**

Two men charged in the illegal sales of counterfeit Denver Broncos merchandise at the Mile High Flea Market were sentenced to three years of probation Tuesday in Adams County District Court.

Marc Misko (DOB 04/09/54) had pleaded guilty to solicitation to commit money laundering (F4). He also was fined \$7,500. Mitchell Misko (DOB 04/09/54) had pleaded guilty to conspiracy to commit theft (F5). He also was fined \$5,000.

The Misko brothers were charged in August along with Glenn Ford (DOB 09/10/52) and David Brian Henrichsen (DOB 03/22/65). They were charged with operating a business selling counterfeit sports merchandise at the Mile High Flea Market from November 14, 2006 to January 10, 2015.

Ford has pleaded guilty to conspiracy to commit theft (F5) and is set for sentencing December 13. Henrichsen's next court appearance is December 15 for setting of preliminary hearing.

U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement's Homeland Security Investigations (HSI) and the Economic Crime Unit of the District Attorney's Office conducted a joint investigation into the illegal sales after the operation became known in 2014.
