Brandon Karr Sentenced to 26 Years in Trailer Park Shooting

Brandon Karr was sentenced to 26 years in prison Friday for second-degree murder and attempted first-degree murder in a shooting at an Adams County mobile home park last year.

Karr (DOB 02/24/92) fired behind him out of a vehicle into a crowd as he and a group friends drove away after a confrontation with occupants of one of the residences at the Berkley Village Mobile Home Park at 5400 Sheridan Boulevard on August 16, 2016. His victims were a group of people gathered for a party at a trailer next door. Edgar Loera Munoz, 30, was killed. Sergio Ontiveros-Heredia, 26, and Perla Nevarez, 24, suffered gunshot wounds.

Karr was convicted in May of one count of second-degree murder heat of passion, nine counts of attempted first-degree murder and two counts of second-degree assault.

Evidence during the week-long trial showed that Karr and his companions drove to the mobile home park to provoke a fight with occupants of one of the trailers. Rojelio Heredia (DOB 10/21/91), who lived next door and was hosting a party, fired two warning shots into the air after the group began attacking a woman. As Karr's group returned to their vehicle and drove off, Karr fired backwards out of the moving car, striking his victims. Heredia responded by firing back at Karr's vehicle, hitting his cousin, Dustin Karr (DOB 02/05/94), who died of his injuries.

Adams County District Judge Ted Tow said Karr and Heredia both "inserted themselves into someone else's fight. They both brought a gun to a fistfight and indiscriminately shot at other people."

Heredia pleaded guilty to second-degree murder heat of passion and was sentenced to 10 years in prison June 26.
