Teen Charged with Attempted Murder in Broomfield Shooting

17th Judicial District Attorney Dave Young announced Thursday that Luis Gustavo Sanchez has been charged with attempted first-degree murder in a shooting in Broomfield on March 22 that left a 17-year-old teen paralyzed.

Broomfield police responded to a call of shots fired in the area of West 131st Avenue and Grove Place in Broomfield on March 22. A 17-year-old juvenile had been shot in the back and transported to Denver Health Medical Center. Another teen fled after being shot at.

Sanchez (DOB 4-30-2000) is charged as an adult with two counts of attempted first-degree murder (F2), first degree assault (F3), attempted first-degree assault (F4) and two counts of crime of violence, sentencing enhancers.

He was advised of the charges Thursday in Broomfield District Court. A preliminary hearing is set for 8:30 a.m. June 21 in Division A of Broomfield District Court. He is free on \$100,000 bond with GPS, monitored sobriety and a 9 p.m. curfew.

The filing of a criminal charge is merely a formal accusation that an individual committed a crime under Colorado laws. A defendant is presumed innocent until and unless proven guilty.
