Frequently Asked Questions

1. What excludes someone from being accepted into Diversion?

Any prior felony conviction or owing more restitution than can be paid back to the victim within two years.

2. What happens if someone is not accepted into the program?

Formal charges may be filed and a summons to appear in court will be mailed.

3. How long does the program take to complete?

The length of time depends on the individual contract and a client’s progress, but usually this is from six to ten months.

4. How much does Diversion cost?

A non-refundable \$25 application fee is required. Upon acceptance, an additional contract signing fee of up to \$75 is required, based on income.

5. What is the benefit of Diversion?

Upon successful completion of Diversion, no further court action will be taken and the charge will be dismissed. The court record may be sealed or expunged.

6. How frequently do I have to attend Diversion meetings?

Typically, each client meets with their client manager twice per month in addition to group meetings and other services.

7. Is community service required?

All clients must complete forty hours of meaningful community restitution service with an approved non-profit agency in the community.

Client Services are determined by a detailed risk and needs assessment.

Every contract consists of five core elements and expectations:

- Regular Diversion Meetings
- Education and Employment Goals
- Behavioral Expectations
- Substance Use Standards or Treatment
- Community Restorative Justice
