Man Sentenced to 22 Years in Prison for Sex Trafficking of Two Teens

Raymond Fredericks was sentenced Thursday to 22 years in prison for sex trafficking of two minors.

Fredericks (DOB 07/24/87) was a registered sex offender from a previous conviction when he was arrested for sexual offenses involving two girls, ages 14 and 15 last year. Fredericks had been in contact with the girls through social media for nearly a year. On April 8, 2018, he picked up the girls and took them to his residence at 3042 N. Uvalda Street in Aurora and sexually assaulted both girls in the garage of the home.

He pleaded guilty on May 24, 2019 to one count of human trafficking of a minor for sexual servitude (F2) naming both victims in a plea agreement that called for a sentence of 15 to 24 years in prison.

Senior Deputy District Attorney Christopher Rossi said Fredericks had squandered the opportunity for treatment and rehabilitation that he was offered after his conviction in 2009. "After being released from treatment, he reverted to the problem that got him into trouble the first time. He immediately got back on line and engaged in the same behaviors."

Rossi asked for a maximum 24-year sentence. "We need to protect the two victims who were 14 and 15 years old at the time, and we clearly need to protect the community from him as well," Rossi told the court at the sentencing hearing. "He has made it very clear he cannot be trusted to be in the community with these sexual issues he is dealing with."

Adams County District Judge Roberto Ramirez sentenced Fredericks to 22 years in prison. "No sentence will put these little girls back to where they were," he said.
