Man Sentenced to 20 Years for Human Trafficking of Two Teenaged Girls for Sex

Kamiko Miles was sentenced to 20 years in prison Wednesday for human trafficking charges involving two 14-year-old girls.

Miles (DOB 09/13/92) recruited the girls off the street in Las Vegas, NV, and brought them to Colorado where he pimped them out for sexual services for several days last October. He also sexually assaulted the two girls in Las Vegas.

The case was initiated by Commerce City Police, who first questioned the girls regarding a shop-lifting report at Travel America at 5101 Quebec Street, and was investigated by the FBI Child Exploitation and Human Trafficking Task Force.

The case was prosecuted by Senior Deputy District Attorney Christopher Rossi of the Human Trafficking Unit of the District Attorney's Office.

An Adams County District Court jury convicted Miles on all charges after a trial in December. They are:

- Human Trafficking Minor for Sexual Servitude (F2) – 2 counts
- Pimping of a Child (F3) – 2 counts
- Procurement of a Child (F3) - 2 counts
- Soliciting Child Prostitution (F3) – 2 counts
- Contributing to Delinquency of Minor (F4) – 2 counts

Rossi told the court at the sentencing hearing that Miles took advantage of two vulnerable teenaged girls for his own benefit. He asked the judge for a 32-year sentence in prison.

Adams County District Judge Sean Finn sentenced Miles to 20 years in prison.
