Judge Rules Emanuel Doll Ruled Competent to Stand Trial in Child's Murder

Broomfield County District Judge Don Quick ruled Friday that Emanuel Joseph Doll has been restored to competency to stand trial for first-degree murder of his 4-year-old nephew.

Doll (DOB 03/02/92) is charged with one count of first-degree murder after deliberation (F1) and one count of first-degree murder of a child by a person in a position of trust (F1) in the death of his nephew on April 27, 2017.

In March 2018, Broomfield County District Judge Michael Goodbee ruled that Doll was incompetent to stand trial and ordered that Doll be committed to the Colorado Mental Health Institute in Pueblo.

Judge Quick's ruling follows a competency hearing held in January.

A preliminary hearing is set for 8:30 a.m. April 17 in Division A.

The filing of a criminal charge is merely a formal accusation that an individual committed a crime under Colorado laws. A defendant is presumed innocent until and unless proven guilty. See Colo. RPC 3.6.
