SEVENTEENTH JUDICIAL DISTRICT GRAND JURY INDICTMENT	

Of the 2025-2026 term of the Adams District Court in the year 2026; the 2025-2026 Adams County Grand Jurors, chosen, selected and sworn in the name and by the authority of the People of the State of Colorado, upon their oaths, present the following:

ESSENTIAL FACTS

From February of 2024 through November of 2024, Adrian Grigg (hereinafter GRIGG) committed numerous crimes along the thoroughfares of 120th Street, 135th Street and 144th Avenue in the Colorado cities of Westminster, Broomfield, Arvada, Thornton and others. GRIGG unlawfully entered businesses by breaking a window or door or accessing a lock box. Once inside, GRIGG took any easily accessible cash from a safe or cash drawers. These incidents occurred when the businesses were closed, usually between 0000 and 0600.

On August 9, 2024, Broomfield Police contacted GRIGG at around 0240 hours and positively identified him using a DMV photo. On that date, GRIGG was riding a silver bicycle and wearing a black "Colorado" hoodie-style sweatshirt.

On August 22, 2024, police seized an Acura MDX that they believed GRIGG used in connection with some of the aforementioned incidents. described above. some of these burglaries. GRIGG confirmed to detectives that the Acura MDX was his primary mode of transportation. After the Acura was seized, law enforcement later determined that GRIGG was using a 2002 Honda CRV with stolen license plates. The Honda was registered to GRIGG and his girlfriend, Kimberly BOUCHER (hereinafter BOUCHER). In November of 2024, law enforcement contacted BOUCHER in that same Honda. Law enforcement searched both the Acura and the Honda and discovered items believed to be associated with the aforementioned burglaries.

On or about August 22, 2024, law enforcement contacted GRIGG and BOUCHER. Police learned that before the arrest, GRIGG and BOUCHER were sharing the same cell phone account. GRIGG and BOUCHER informed law enforcement that they recently purchased separate cell phones..

Law enforcement obtained search warrants for GRIGG's cell phone data, which included location data as well as communications between him and several others. Law enforcement also completed an extraction of the cell phone belonging to Kimberly BOUCHER.

Pursuant to this investigation, BOUCHER spoke to police and confirmed GRIGG's involvement in multiple burglaries during the relevant time frame. Police conducted an interview with Adrian GRIGG on January 21, 2025. During this interview, GRIGG confirmed his association with other individuals including William "David" HOGGE, Justin CRUM, and Jacqueline NEUMANN.

Police also conducted an interview with Kimberly BOUCHER on January 23, 2025. BOUCHER also confirmed GRIGG's association with William "David" HOGGE, Justin CRUM, and Jacqueline NEUMANN. She stated that all of those individuals, including herself, participated in burglaries with GRIGG during Autumn of 2024.

During the relevant time period, eighty-one similar incidents were reported to and investigated by law enforcement in several jurisdictions in the State of Colorado. The businesses reporting these crimes lost approximately \$42,000 in stolen property and incurred approximately \$77,000 in property damage as a result of these incidents.

COUNT ONE
SECOND DEGREE BURGLARY
C.R.S. § 18-4-203(1)(2)(A) F-4

On or about February 21st, 2024, in the State of Colorado, Adrian GRIGG unlawfully, feloniously and knowingly broke an entrance into, entered, or remained unlawfully after a lawful or unlawful entry in occupied structure or building being used for the operation of a commercial business of Jersey Mike's, located at 12003 N Pecos St, Westminster, CO, with the intent to commit therein the crime of Theft; in violation of 18-4-203(1)(2)(a), C.R.S.

The offense alleged in Count One was committed in the following manner:

On February 21, 2024, around 0420 hours, the burglar alarm was activated at Jersey Mike's located at 12003 N Pecos St, Westminster, Adams County, Colorado. Surveillance video shows an individual wearing jeans, a hoodie with the hood up, white tennis shoes and a backpack had accessed the lockbox outside the restaurant. Using the key, the suspect entered the store and triggered the alarm. The person ran quickly throughout the restaurant, falling in the back area at one point. During this incident, the suspect took \$155.00 and took the key to the store. After the incident, the business owners were unable to locate the lockbox, valued at approximately \$20. Kimberly BOUCHER confirmed in an interview with law enforcement that this incident was Adrian GRIGG's first burglary. Cell phone records for GRIGG and BOUCHER contain a conversation between GRIGG and BOUCHER on February 26, 2024, confirming GRIGG's involvement in this incident. GRIGG indicated a desire to branch out and commit more burglaries on his own:

Kimberly BOUCHER: "Wait did ditch make money? We didn't huh"

Adrian GRIGG: "No.....so I'm kinda irritated with him right now dude. Like fuck he keeps wanting to change his mind on where to go and what to hit. And guess what> Now we are back at his ex girlfriend's house getting the Daily, for a safe that's at Jersey Mikes."

Adrian GRIGG: "And we are leaving now"

Kimberly BOUCHER: "Wow all this time and nothing... I'm sorry my love"

Adrian GRIGG: “Yea this is why I could just do things by myself for the most part. Like I would have gone into that sushi place already. And he didn’t want to go in cause he wants to get a better idea of the layout.”

GRIGG and BOUCHER shared one phone at the time of this incident. Data from that phone showed activity near Littleton, Colorado during the timeframe of this incident.

On or about February 27, 2024, in the State of Colorado, Adrian GRIGG, unlawfully, feloniously, and knowingly broke an entrance into, entered, or remained unlawfully after a lawful or unlawful entry in the occupied structure or building being used for the operation of a commercial business of Metro by T-Mobile, located at 10351 Grant St, Unit #7, Thornton, CO, with the intent to commit therein the crime of Theft; in violation of section 18-4-203(1),(2)(a), C.R.S.

The offense alleged in Count Two was committed in the following manner:

On or about February 27th, 2024, around 0702 hours, surveillance footage showed an individual enter the Metro by T-Mobile, located at 10351 Grant St #7, Thornton, Adams County, Colorado. The suspect entered the business through the front door after cutting the lockbox and obtaining the key, valued at \$25. The suspect was wearing all black and had a backpack and bolt cutters. The total damage to the business was \$1,136.03. Cell phone records from GRIGG and BOUCHER also confirm GRIGG’s involvement in this incident. On February 27, 2024, around 0205 hours, GRIGG and BOUCHER has the following conversation:

Adrian GRIGG: “Hey my love there’s a cop in rtd parking lot so I’m gonna head to the metro PCS store”

Adrian GRIGG: “I love you ;*”

Kimberly BOUCHER: “Ok be safe I love you”

Data from Adrian GRIGG’s and Kimberly BOUCHER’s shared phone showed activity near Littleton, Colorado during the timeframe of this incident.

COUNT THREE
SECOND DEGREE BURGLARY

On or about March 18, 2024, in the State of Colorado, Adrian GRIGG, unlawfully, feloniously, and knowingly broke an entrance into, entered, or remained unlawfully after a lawful or unlawful entry in the occupied structure or building being used for the operation of a commercial business of Jersey Mike's, located at 12003 N Pecos St, Westminster, CO, with the intent to commit therein the crime of Theft; in violation of section 18-4-203(1),(2)(a), C.R.S.

The offense alleged in Count Three was committed in the following manner:

On March 18, 2024, around 0348, surveillance footage showed two suspects enter Jersey Mike's, located at 12003 N Pecos St, Westminster, Adams County, Colorado. The two suspects entered through a damaged window panel using pliers. One suspect appeared to attempt to access the safe, while the other took an undetermined amount of potato chips. The first male was of average build, dressed in all black with his hood up. The second male was also dressed in black with a bag across his chest. This male was heavyset. The suspects did not appear to have taken any money from the register, and the safe remained in place. The only items that appeared to be missing were the chips. The estimated cost of the chips was \$10, and a Google search showed an average cost of \$250 for the damaged window. The individual captured on the surveillance footage matched the general physical description of Adrian GRIGG.

Data from Adrian GRIGG's and Kimberly BOUCHER's shared phone showed no activity during the timeframe of this incident.

COUNT FOUR
SECOND DEGREE BURGLARY

On or about March 20, 2024, in the State of Colorado, Adrian GRIGG, unlawfully, feloniously, and knowingly broke an entrance into, entered, or remained unlawfully after a lawful or unlawful entry in the occupied structure or building being used for the operation of a commercial business of Snarf's Sandwich, located at 1975 W 120th Ave Unit 900, Westminster, CO, with the intent to commit therein the crime of Theft; in violation of section 18-4-203(1),(2)(a), C.R.S.

The offense alleged in Count Four was committed in the following manner:

On March 20, 2024, around 0405, surveillance video showed an individual entering Snarf's Sandwich, located at 1975 W. 120th Ave Unit 900, Westminster, Adams County, Colorado. The suspect gained entry by damaging a small window of the business. After entering the business, the suspect went to the cash register and pried it open with what appeared to be a screwdriver, stealing around \$300 in cash. The suspect was wearing a mask, hoodie, gloves and shorts. Snarf's paid \$439.98 to

repair the damaged window. The individual captured on the surveillance footage matched the general physical description of Adrian GRIGG.

Data from Adrian GRIGG's and Kimberly BOUCHER's shared phone showed no activity during the timeframe of this incident.

Data from Adrian GRIGG's and Kimberly BOUCHER's shared phone showed no activity during the timeframe of this incident.

On or about June 2nd, 2024, overnight into June 3rd, 2024, an individual unlawfully entered the Rice Guy Food Truck, located at 12801 Washington St, Thornton, Adams County, Colorado. The suspect damaged a window to the truck and gained entry, taking a red Powermate generator. The damage to the window was \$400. The generator was valued at \$2,500. The generator was a 5000-watt, 6200 Max Power, red in color. The generator had no wheels on it. The owner of the generator had made some repairs to it that included a black zip tie near the spark plug area.

After the incident, the generator's owner searched for the generator on Facebook Marketplace to see if anyone had listed it for sale. The owner came across an ad for what the owner believed was his generator based on the generator in the Marketplace listing having a matching black zip tie and no wheels. The Marketplace seller of the generator was listed as "Adrian Grigg." Cell phone records obtained from the shared phone of Adrian GRIGG and Kimberly BOUCHER confirmed that the generator was listed on Facebook Marketplace by Adrian GRIGG. Records also revealed a conversation between the generator's owner and Adrian GRIGG, where GRIGG admits to having possession of the generator, claiming it belonged to a friend. 

Records obtained pursuant to this investigation revealed the following conversation took place on June 3, 2024, between GRIGG and the generator's owner:

Owner: "Hey bro. I know that's my generator. I see you're a business owner so I'm sure you understand how much real value a machine has to a business. Just like you need electricity to power your detailing business I need that generator to power my food truck. It barely works anyway but it's all I have. I would appreciate it if you would just give me the generator back. We can meet up and give it back to me."

GRIGG: "Bro I had no idea... My buddy asked me to post it cause he doesn't have Facebook. I didn't know and I don't even physically have it. I took the post down and I'm trying to get ahold of him. I'm sorry for real. I will do my best to get it back to you."

Owner: “Oh and there’s a nice speaker that is missing too... It’s jbl... Would be awesome if I could get that back to.”

GRIGG: “I haven’t seen that but I will see. JBL like what model?”

Owner: “It’s just a small square”

Owner: “Any updates on that generator bro.”

Owner: “I gotta run tomorrow morning”

A separate message chain also occurred between Adrian GRIGG and a potential buyer for the generator:

Buyer: “Hi, is this available?”

Buyer: “Im really interested in buying this today.”

Buyer: “I can meet you after work? I just bought a house and i’m in need of a good generator”

GRIGG: “Ok what time?”

Buyer: “Can you do 7?”

GRIGG: “Sorry for late reply did you still want to pick it up? Do you not have power in your new place or?”

Buyer: “I do what’s the latest or what time is a good time. I bought a house and it’s somewhat very old house so I just need a generator to get me thru til the electrician can come and wire my house correctly.”

GRIGG: “Honestly whenever works for you. Are you having someone help you load it and unload it? It’s heavy! Just male [sic] sure not to run it inside”

Based on additional messages between Adrian GRIGG and the buyer, the generator appears to have been sold by GRIGG around 2200 hours on June 3, 2024.

Data from Adrian GRIGG’s and Kimberly BOUCHER’s shared phone, during the timeframe of this incident, showed activity consistent with the device being at their known encampment near W 116th Avenue and Pecos Street.

The damage to the window was \$400. The individual captured on the surveillance footage matched the general physical description of Adrian GRIGG.

On or about June 6th, 2024, starting around 0030 hours, surveillance footage showed an individual enter Eyebrow Threading, located at 14697 N Delaware Street, Westminster, Adams County, Colorado after normal business hours. Around 0030 hours, surveillance footage shows what appears to be a male suspect peering into the business windows. The suspect was wearing a dark colored hoodie, facial covering, shorts, dark beanie with a light stripe around the base, dark gloves, and a backpack. The suspect walked back and forth a few times and struggled unsuccessfully to open the door to the business. After attempting to open the business door, the suspect left and came back with a dark colored bicycle. When dismounting the bicycle, it appeared the suspect was wearing lighter colored shoes. Eventually the suspect made entry into the business around 0035 hours. Once inside, the suspect walked straight to the back counter, took the cash register, then quickly walked back out. The cash register had approximately \$500 dollars inside, plus tips and two gift cards. The door lock damage was around \$550. The individual captured on the surveillance footage matched the general physical description of Adrian GRIGG.

Data from Adrian GRIGG's and Kimberly BOUCHER's shared phone during the timeframe of this incident showed activity consistent with the device being at their known encampment near West 116th Avenue and Pecos Street.

The offense alleged in Count Twenty-Two was committed in the following manner:

On or about June 9th, 2024, surveillance footage showed an individual entering Crumbl, located at 9770 Washington St, Thornton, Adams County, Colorado after normal business hours. The suspect damaged the glass front door to the business and immediately went behind the counter to the cash register. The suspect took the cash register and left the business. The surveillance footage shows the suspect is wearing a black hoodie, gray shorts with white trim, and white shoes. This clothing is similar to the clothing worn by the suspect from the previous Crumbl incident (TPD 202408236) that occurred on June 4, 2024. During this incident, the suspect took \$155.43 from the cash register, and it cost \$1,935.50 to replace the front door. The individual captured on the surveillance footage matched the general physical description of Adrian GRIGG.

Data from Adrian GRIGG's and Kimberly BOUCHER's shared phone during the timeframe of this incident showed activity consistent with the device being at their known encampment near West 116th Avenue and Pecos Street.

The suspect damaged a small window and attempted to access the cash register through that window. No money was taken from the register, and it cost \$1,289 to replace the window. The suspect was wearing a dark hoodie, gloves, and white shoes. The suspect left on a bicycle with a dolly attached to it. The dolly was attached to the bicycle with a bar.

The individual captured on the surveillance footage matched the general physical description of Adrian GRIGG.

Data from Adrian GRIGG's and Kimberly BOUCHER's shared phone, during the timeframe of this incident, showed activity consistent with the device being at their known encampment near West 116th Avenue and Pecos Street.

The offense alleged in Count Twenty-Four was committed in the following manner:

On or about June 14th, 2024, around 0405 hours, surveillance footage showed an individual entering Jack in the Box, located at 2105 W. 136th Ave, Broomfield, Broomfield County, Colorado after normal business hours. The suspect damaged the drive-thru window and took the cash register. The cost to replace the window was \$2,000. There was \$150 in the register, and it cost \$300 to replace the register. The suspect appeared to be a male wearing black shorts, white shoes, light or neon gloves, and a black hoodie with white lettering (similar to the "Colorado" hoodie observed in previous incidents during the relevant time frame)..The individual captured on the surveillance footage matched the general physical description of Adrian GRIGG.

Data from Adrian GRIGG's and Kimberly BOUCHER's shared phone showed no activity during the timeframe of this incident.

The video showed the suspect damage the drive-thru window. According to Taco Bell employees, it did not appear that the cash register was tampered with and nothing was missing. This incident occurred about forty minutes after the Jack in the Box incident described in Count Twenty-Four. The Jack in the Box and this Taco Bell are located in the same parking lot. It cost around \$643 to fix the window. The suspect appeared to be a male wearing black shorts, white shoes, light or neon gloves, and a black hoodie with white lettering (similar to the "Colorado" hoodie observed in previous incidents during the relevant time frame). The individual captured on the surveillance footage matched the general physical description of Adrian GRIGG and that individual appeared to be wearing the same clothing as the individual captured on surveillance video in Count Twenty-Four.

Data from Adrian GRIGG's and Kimberly BOUCHER's shared phone showed no activity during the timeframe of this incident.

The offense alleged in Count Twenty-Six was committed in the following manner:

On or about June 16th, 2024, around 0505 hours, surveillance footage showed an individual entering Mike's Auto Spa, located at 12131 N Federal Pkwy, Westminster, Adams County, Colorado after normal business hours. In that footage, the suspect is observed arriving on a bicycle and proceeding to break a glass panel on the business's bay door to access the latch and then enter the car detail bay. The suspect was inside the business for approximately three minutes. The suspect took a 12-volt battery jump box worth \$200.00 and two buffers used for vehicle detailing, worth \$200.00 each, for an estimated total value of approximately \$600. The damage to the bay door glass was estimated at \$700.00. The suspect appeared to be male, wearing denim shorts, white sneakers, black gloves, a gray hoodie with the hood pulled up, and a face covering. The suspect also had a black backpack and was riding

a bicycle described as black and yellow, resembling a road bike. The suspect's description appeared to be around 5'6" in height and approximately 160 pounds. However, cellular data and phone activity cannot rule out GRIGG's presence at the incident location due to geographic proximity between the campsite and the crime scene.

The offense alleged in Count Twenty-Seven was committed in the following manner:

On or about June 18th, 2024, at approximately 0357 hours, surveillance footage showed an individual enter Scalzotto's Italian Restaurant, located at 12015 Melody Dr, Westminster, Adams County, Colorado after normal business hours. Based on surveillance footage, it appears the northern door of the restaurant was not secured by staff when closing the restaurant, and the suspect gained entry through this same unsecured door. The suspect was wearing a gray hoodie, gray shorts, white tennis shoes, yellow gloves and a face mask. The suspect had a road bike and a large backpack. The suspect entered the restaurant and took a safe that contained three-days' worth of cash for the business, however, the business owner was unable to estimate the amount of cash taken. A Google search showed the safe to cost around \$250. The individual captured on the surveillance footage matched the general physical description of Adrian GRIGG.

Data from Adrian GRIGG's and Kimberly BOUCHER's shared phone during the timeframe of this incident showed activity consistent with the device being at their known encampment near W 116th Avenue and Pecos Street.

COUNT TWENTY-EIGHT

On or about June 20, 2024, in the State of Colorado, Adrian GRIGG, unlawfully, feloniously, and knowingly broke an entrance into, entered, or remained unlawfully after a lawful or unlawful entry in the occupied structure or building being used for the operation of a commercial business of Tiger Sugar, located at 2831 West 120th Avenue, Unit 100, Westminster, CO, with the intent to commit therein the crime of Theft; in violation of section 18-4-203(1),(2)(a), C.R.S.

The offense alleged in Count Twenty-Eight was committed in the following manner:

On or about June 20th, 2024, around 0111 hours, surveillance footage showed an individual entering Tiger Sugar, located at 2831 W 120th Ave Unit 100, Westminster, Adams County, Colorado after normal business hours. From the footage, what appeared to be a male suspect broke into the bottom rectangular window of the business around 0111 hours. The window located to the right of the front door had been completely broken out, with glass shards landing both inside and outside the business. The suspect crawled through the broken window and went to the cash register located on the front counter. The suspect was seen in the video wearing a black jacket, gray undershirt, black shorts, white shoes, with yellow gloves. The suspect had the hood on the hoodie up over his head. The suspect was in and out of the store within a few minutes and took with him a small interior part of the cash register containing approximately \$470. The entire register had to be replaced, costing around \$1,000, for a total of \$1,470 in losses to the store. The window damages were estimated at \$1,100. The individual captured on the surveillance footage matched the general physical description of Adrian GRIGG.

However, cellular data and phone activity cannot rule out GRIGG's presence at the incident location due to geographic proximity between the campsite and the crime scene.

On or about June 22nd, 2024, surveillance footage showed an individual enter the Rocky Mountain Chocolate Factory, located at 14647 N Delaware St Unit 1200, Westminster, Adams County, Colorado after normal business hours. Based on the footage, the suspect damaged the lockbox to the business and used the key to gain access to the store. The suspect opened the door and entered the store quickly. The suspect appeared to be a male with medium skin color, darker colored shorts, black hoodie with the hood up, white or light-colored shoes, yellow gloves and a black backpack. This clothing was similar to the clothing worn by the suspect from the Tiger Sugar incident described in Count Twenty-Eight, which occurred two days prior to this incident. The suspect cut a wire to the register and took the cash register box, valued at \$250. The lockbox damage was around \$50 and the missing key from the lockbox was valued around \$10. There was \$150 in the cash register, and it would cost \$350 to replace the cut wire. The total amount taken was \$410 and the total damage to property was \$400. The individual captured on the surveillance footage matched the general physical description of Adrian GRIGG.

Data from Adrian GRIGG's and Kimberly BOUCHER's shared phone during the timeframe of this incident showed activity consistent with the device being at their known encampment near W 116th Avenue and Pecos Street.

The suspect cut the lock on the rear door and took \$317 dollars from inside the truck. A Google search showed an average cost of \$20 for the lock. From the footage, the suspect was wearing a t-shirt, shorts, white shoes and had a backpack with bolt cutters sticking out. The individual captured on the surveillance footage matched the general physical

description of Adrian GRIGG. The backpack with bolt cutters was similar to the backpack containing bolt cutters worn by the suspect in Count Sixteen.


Data from Adrian GRIGG's and Kimberly BOUCHER's shared phone, during the timeframe of this incident, showed activity consistent with the device being at their known encampment near W 116th Avenue and Pecos Street.

The suspect went back inside the business to retrieve a second safe, taking that safe too. The suspect was wearing a black hoodie with the hood up, shorts, and white shoes. The total amount taken from the safes was \$4,450 and it cost \$899.19 to fix the damaged glass. The individual captured on the surveillance footage matched the general physical description of Adrian GRIGG.



Data from Adrian GRIGG's and Kimberly BOUCHER's shared phone showed no activity during the timeframe of this incident.

The suspect approached a window at the check-in counter for the golf course, looked around, and then used a window punch tool to shatter a window. It cost \$500 to replace the window. The suspect then used a pry bar to reach further into the building but was unable to get into the cash register. Data from Adrian GRIGG's and Kimberly BOUCHER's shared phone during the timeframe of this incident showed activity consistent with the device being at their known encampment near W 116th Avenue and Pecos Street. However, the phone activity cannot rule out a presence at the incident location due to the geographic proximity of the camp to the crime scene.

The total amount taken was \$1,700 and it cost \$1,000 to fix the window. The individual captured on the surveillance footage matched the general physical description of Adrian GRIGG.

Data from Adrian GRIGG's and Kimberly BOUCHER's shared phone, during the timeframe of this incident, showed activity consistent with the device being at their known encampment near W 116th Avenue and Pecos Street.

The second suspect was wearing a Champion hoodie, hat, backpack, black gloves, and a face covering. It cost Los Rancheros Food Truck \$2,000 to fix the rear door. One suspect is currently unknown, however the suspect observed on the bicycle matches the general description of Adrian GRIGG.

The suspect left the business on his bicycle. The suspect was wearing a black hoodie, black and red shorts, black Nike shoes, black gloves and a black face covering. The suspect had a slender build. The damaged window cost \$2,940 to repair. The individual captured on the surveillance footage matched the general physical description of Adrian GRIGG.

Data from Adrian GRIGG's and Kimberly BOUCHER's shared phone during the timeframe of this incident showed activity consistent with the device being at their known encampment near W 116th Avenue and Pecos Street. However, cellular data and phone activity cannot rule out GRIGG's presence at the incident location due to geographic proximity between the campsite and the crime scene.

the operation of a commercial business of Crumbl, located at 9770 Washington Ave, Thornton, CO, with the intent to commit therein the crime of Theft; in violation of section 18-4-203(1),(2)(a), C.R.S.

The offense alleged in Count Thirty-Six was committed in the following manner:

On or about July 23rd, 2024, around 0324 hours, an individual entered Crumbl, located at 9700 Washington Ave, Thornton, Adams County, Colorado after normal business hours. There was no surveillance footage, but the business alarm was activated at 0324 hours. Based on the damage to the business, the suspect entered by shattering a window next to the front door. The suspect then took \$303.01 from a cash bag and left the area. It cost \$503 to replace the damaged window.

Data from Adrian GRIGG's and Kimberly BOUCHER's shared phone during the timeframe of this incident showed activity consistent with the device being at their known encampment near W 116th Avenue and Pecos Street.

Footage showed the suspect damaged the drive-thru window with a window punch. The suspect then reached into the business and opened the cash register. The suspect took \$650 in cash from the register and left the area on a bicycle. It cost Golden Scoop \$500 to replace the window. The suspect was wearing a black hoodie, black backpack, long black shorts, purple gloves. The suspect appeared to have dark skin. This incident occurred within an hour of Count Thirty-Six (Crumbl, July 23, 2024, at 0324). Golden Scoop is located 2.3 miles from Crumbl (estimated on Google as a 14-minute bicycle ride). The individual captured on the surveillance footage matched the general physical description of Adrian GRIGG. [REDACTED], [REDACTED].

Data from Adrian GRIGG's and Kimberly BOUCHER's shared phone showed no activity during the timeframe of this incident.

The offense alleged in Count Thirty-Eight was committed in the following manner:

On or about July 25th, 2024, around 0131 hours, surveillance footage showed an individual entering Cracker Barrel, located at 350 W 120th Ave, Northglenn, Adams County, Colorado after normal business hours. Footage showed the suspect damaged a small glass pane on the front door and then opened the front door. The suspect entered the business and ran toward the cash registers. The suspect took gift cards and ran out of the business and onto his bicycle. The suspect is seen wearing a hood over his face and gloves. The damaged window cost \$200 to replace and \$10 was taken in gift cards. The individual captured on the surveillance footage matched the general physical description of Adrian GRIGG.

Data from Adrian GRIGG's and Kimberly BOUCHER's shared phone during the timeframe of this incident showed activity consistent with the device being at their known encampment near W 116th Avenue and Pecos Street. However, cellular data and phone activity cannot rule out GRIGG's presence at the incident location due to geographic proximity between the campsite and the crime scene.

On or about July 27th, 2024, around 0130 hours, surveillance footage showed an individual entering Bangkok Ave, located at 3700 W. 144 Ave #E1200, Broomfield, Broomfield County, Colorado after normal business hours. Surveillance footage showed the suspect damaging the lock box that was attached to the front door. The suspect made entry with the key from the damaged lockbox and went to the cash register, which was unlocked and open. The suspect took \$160 in cash and left the business. It cost \$30 to replace the damaged lock box and \$143 to rekey the business. The total amount damaged was \$273. The suspect was seen wearing all black clothing, a face covering, white shoes and a backpack. It was noted the suspect arrived at the business on a bicycle with a red hitch, coming from the west. The individual captured on the surveillance footage matched the general physical description of Adrian GRIGG.

Data from Adrian GRIGG's and Kimberly BOUCHER's shared phone during the timeframe of this incident showed activity consistent with the device being at their known encampment near W 116th Avenue and Pecos Street.

On or about July 29th, 2024, in the State of Colorado, around 0210 hours, surveillance footage showed an individual entering Perfection Nails and Spa, located at 12026 N. Melody Dr, Westminster, Adams County, Colorado after normal business hours. From the footage, what appeared to be a male suspect rode a bicycle into the parking lot from W 120th Ave. The suspect then walked in front of the business for about a minute, looked around, and then used an unknown hand tool to break the glass on the front door. The male went inside the business briefly, then exited holding the business's cash register. The male attempted to put the cash register on the bicycle but dropped it on the ground. The male broke into the cash register and then went to the business's dumpster and left the area on the bicycle. The male appeared to be white or Hispanic, wearing a dark colored hoodie, black Colorado Rockies hat, gray shirt(?) covering his face, basketball shorts, black gloves, and black Nikes with a white "Swoosh." The register contained around \$135. It cost around \$1,000 to fix

the glass door. The individual captured on the surveillance footage matched the general physical description of Adrian GRIGG.

Specialized location data from Adrian GRIGG's and Kimberly BOUCHER's shared phone showed the device was present in the immediate vicinity of this incident during the time the crime was committed.

On August 2nd, 2024, a report was taken of a burglary that took place overnight at the Tokyo House Restaurant, located at 3013 W 104th Ave, Westminster, Adams County, Colorado. The report stated that the restaurant had been locked overnight, and the restaurant key from the padlock was missing. The restaurant's cash register was taken. The cash register cost \$500, and it contained \$3,000. The padlock cost \$200 to replace. A search of Adrian GRIGG's phone showed a Google Maps search for Tokyo House.

Data from Adrian GRIGG's and Kimberly BOUCHER's shared phone during the timeframe of this incident showed activity consistent with the device being at their known encampment near W 116th Avenue and Pecos Street, as well as the areas around northern Westminster and southern Broomfield, Colorado. Phone data shows the location for Tokyo House was searched using Google Maps.

Midway Blvd, Broomfield, CO, with the intent to commit therein the crime of Theft; in violation of section 18-4-203(1),(2)(a), C.R.S.

The offense alleged in Count Forty-Two was committed in the following manner:

On or about August 7th, 2024, around 0047 hours, surveillance footage showed an individual entering Little Caesars, located at 2420 E. Midway Blvd, Broomfield, Broomfield County, Colorado, after normal business hours. Footage showed what appeared to be a male suspect enter from the rear door of the building after damaging the lock. The suspect entered the lobby area and attempted to use a grinder tool to open a drop safe near the registers. A Google search showed the damaged window to cost around \$250 and \$56.07 was taken from the register. Data from Adrian GRIGG's and Kimberly BOUCHER's shared phone, during the timeframe of this incident, showed activity consistent with the device being at their known encampment near W 116th Avenue and Pecos Street. However, cellular data and phone activity cannot rule out GRIGG's presence at the incident location due to geographic proximity between the campsite and the crime scene.

POLICE CONTACT OF ADRIAN GRIGG ON AUGUST 8 and 9, 2024

On August 8th, 2024, law enforcement contacted Adrian GRIGG at the 7-Eleven, located at 12057 N Pecos St, Westminster, Colorado. The contact was around 2353 hours and Adrian GRIGG was in a 2004 Gray Acura MDX without any visible plates. Law enforcement released Adrian GRIGG, who was then later contacted by Broomfield Police on his bicycle.

On August 9th, 2024, Broomfield Police conducted an operation pursuant to the investigation into the string of small-business burglaries that had been occurring in the metro area in 2024. During this operation, around 0240 hours, detectives contacted Adrian GRIGG at 118th Ave and Pecos Street, Broomfield. Adrian GRIGG was wearing the black Colorado hoodie observed in several burglaries. Adrian GRIGG was also riding a bicycle, which matched the bicycle observed in several burglaries. Adrian GRIGG reported he was homeless and was living near the open area of W. 116th Ave and N Pecos St, Westminster, Colorado.

The location of Adrian GRIGG's camp was identified, and Detective Coleman with Broomfield Police authored a search warrant for the camp. When executing the search warrant at GRIGG's encampment, the bicycles and clothing associated with GRIGG in the burglaries were not located at the campsite. However, police spoke to Kimberly BOUCHER, who stated she was GRIGG's girlfriend and lived at the camp with GRIGG.

addition, the Acura MDX seen in footage appears similar to the Acura belonging to Adrian GRIGG at that time.

ADRIAN GRIGGS AUGUST INTERVIEW:

On August 22nd, 2024, law enforcement located the Acura MDX associated with Adrian GRIGG at the King Soopers located at 1891 CO-7, Erie, Weld County, Colorado. Adrian GRIGG and Kimberly BOUCHER were located nearby. Interviews were conducted by law enforcement of both individuals. These videos were audio and video recorded. During this encounter, GRIGG was wearing a gray shirt and shorts. Broomfield Police Detective Coleman interviewed Kimberly BOUCHER and received consent to download her phone.

The Acura MDX was towed to Red's Towing (8970 N Federal Blvd) and placed on a police hold.

SEARCH OF 2004 ACURA MDX:

On September 3rd, 2024, law enforcement obtained a search warrant for the Acura. Pursuant to the execution of the search warrant of the vehicle, Detectives located the following:

The suspect approached the business and attempted to punch out a small window. Ultimately, the suspect entered the business by damaging the front glass door. The suspect took the cash register and ran back to a blue Honda Civic. The blue Honda Civic was on scene when Adrian GRIGG was later arrested in November 2024. The amount to fix the glass door was \$1,445.86 and the amount of money taken was \$340.67. The individual captured on the surveillance footage matched the general physical description of Adrian GRIGG. Moreover, the suspect was seen wearing similar clothing on surveillance to clothing recovered during a later search of GRIGG's 2002 Honda CRV.

Data from Adrian GRIGG's phone during the timeframe of this incident showed activity consistent with the device being at his known encampment near W 116th Avenue and Pecos Street. Data from Kimberly BOUCHER's phone showed no activity during the timeframe of this incident.

On or about October 26, 2024, in the State of Colorado, Adrian GRIGG, unlawfully, feloniously, and knowingly broke an entrance into, entered, or remained unlawfully after a lawful or unlawful entry in the occupied structure or building being

used for the operation of a commercial business of Kirin Hotpot and Tu's Kitchen, located at 6500 W. 120th Ave #E and #G, Broomfield, CO, with the intent to commit therein the crime of Theft; in violation of section 18-4-203(1),(2)(a), C.R.S.

The offense alleged in Count Sixty-Seven was committed in the following manner:

On or about October 26th, 2024, around 0449 hours, surveillance footage showed an individual entering Kirin Hotpot (6500 W 120th Ave #E) and Tu's Kitchen (6500 W. 120th Ave #G), located in Broomfield, Broomfield County, Colorado, after normal business hours. Responding officers documented the burglary of both businesses as one incident. Surveillance footage showed the suspect gained entry by damaging a window. Once inside, the suspect took the cash register from Tu's Kitchen. The same suspect then went to Kirin Hotpot, shattered the front glass door and took that cash register. Surveillance showed a blue sedan and dark SUV pulled into the parking lot prior to the crime. The suspect was wearing a dark colored hoodie and grey sweatpants. There was \$2,622 taken from the cash registers at Kirin Hotpot and the single tier cash drawer cost \$40. The two-tier cash drawer was valued at \$429. Tu's Kitchen had \$100 in change in the cash drawer. The total amount taken between both businesses was \$3,191. A Google search showed both businesses paid around \$1,000 each to replace the glass, with a total value of \$2,000. The individual captured on the surveillance footage matched the general physical description of Adrian GRIGG. Moreover, the suspect was seen wearing similar clothing on surveillance to clothing recovered during a later search of GRIGG's 2002 Honda CRV.

Data from Adrian GRIGG's phone showed no activity during the timeframe of this incident. Data from Kimberly BOUCHER's phone also showed no activity during the timeframe of this incident.

SECOND DEGREE BURGLARY
C.R.S. § 18-4-203(1)(2)(A) F-4

On or about October 29, 2024, in the State of Colorado, Adrian GRIGG, unlawfully, feloniously, and knowingly broke an entrance into, entered, or remained unlawfully after a lawful or unlawful entry in the occupied structure or building being used for the operation of a commercial business of Milano Nail and Spa, located at 10436 Town Center Dr, Westminster, CO, with the intent to commit therein the crime of Theft; in violation of section 18-4-203(1),(2)(a), C.R.S.

The offense alleged in Count Sixty-Eight was committed in the following manner:

On or about October 29th, 2024, around 0340 hours, surveillance footage showed an individual entering Milano Nail and Spa, located at 10436 Town Center Dr, Westminster, Adams County, Colorado, after normal business hours. Footage

showed a male suspect walk to the front doors dressed in a gray jacket and dark pants with a mask covering his face. The suspect pulled out a set of bolt cutters from underneath his jacket and cut the lock box containing a key off the front door. The suspect took the lockbox off the door and left the area on foot. The suspect later returned to the business and entered the business through the front door using a key. The suspect walked directly behind the counter to the cash registers, taking about \$400. The lockbox was not recovered and cost around \$20 to replace. The individual captured on the surveillance footage matched the general physical description of Adrian GRIGG. Moreover, the bolt cutters similar to those that the suspect used in this crime were recovered during a later search of GRIGG's 2002 Honda CRV.

Data from Adrian GRIGG's phone during the timeframe of this incident showed activity near his known encampment near W 116th Avenue and Pecos Street. The activity is also consistent with the device being further south from the encampment. The activity does not show in the area of this incident. Data from Kimberly BOUCHER's phone also showed no activity during the timeframe of this incident.

On or about November 1, 2024, in the State of Colorado, Adrian GRIGG, unlawfully, feloniously, and knowingly broke an entrance into, entered, or remained unlawfully after a lawful or unlawful entry in the occupied structure or building being used for the operation of a commercial business of Boss Liquors, located at 5781 E. 128th Ave #160, Thornton, CO, with the intent to commit therein the crime of Theft; in violation of section 18-4-203(1),(2)(a), C.R.S.

The offense alleged in Count Sixty-Nine was committed in the following manner:

On or about November 1st, 2024, around 0320 hours, surveillance footage showed an individual entering Boss Liquors, located at 5781 E 128th Ave #160, Thornton, Adams County, Colorado, after normal business hours. The suspect broke a lock box on the business door and used the key from the lockbox to access the business. The suspect immediately went behind the counter and threw the cash register on the ground. This caused the register to open, and the suspect took \$190 in cash. The business advised it cost \$6,492 to replace the damaged register. The suspect ran out of the business and entered a 2002 Honda CRV. The suspect was wearing a black hoodie, black pants, a black face covering, blue and white sneakers, and blue gloves. The individual captured on the surveillance footage matched the general physical description of Adrian GRIGG. A similar pair of blue and white Etnies sneakers that the suspect was wearing during this crime were recovered during a later search of GRIGG's 2002 Honda CRV.

Data from Adrian GRIGG's phone during the timeframe of this incident showed activity in Brighton Colorado. Data from Kimberly BOUCHER's phone showed no activity during the timeframe of this incident.

COUNT SEVENTY

On or about November 3, 2024, in the State of Colorado, Adrian GRIGG, unlawfully and knowingly took a thing of value, namely: License Plate, of Thi Phan, with the value of less than three hundred dollars; in violation of section 18-4-401(1),(2)(b),(6) C.R.S.

The offense alleged in Count Seventy was committed in the following manner:

On or about November 3rd, 2024, around 1800 hours, a black 2008 Honda CRV belonging to Thi Phan was parked in a parking lot at 1100 W 120th Ave #100, Westminster, Adams County, Colorado. A suspect took the rear license plate off Thi Phan's 2008 Honda CRV. There was no surveillance footage associated with the theft. The stolen rear license plate for Thi Phan's CRV was "ADKG24." The license plate was valued at \$85. On November 11th, 2024, Westminster PD Officer Asbery contacted Kimberly BOUCHER in a 2002 blue Honda CRV known to be associated with BOUCHER and GRIGG. Kimberly BOUCHER advised Adrian GRIGG was with her, but GRIGG was not contacted in the vehicle that night. Video surveillance during the relevant timeframe shows license plate ADKG24 was attached to GRIGG and BOUCHER's CRV following the theft of the license plate. Cell phone data also places Adrian GRIGG and Kimberly BOUCHER in the parking lot of the license plate theft on November 3rd, 2024.

Data from Adrian GRIGG's phone during the timeframe of this incident showed activity consistent with the device being at his known encampment near W 116th Avenue and Pecos Street. However, cellular data and phone activity cannot rule out GRIGG's presence at the incident location due to geographic proximity between the campsite and the crime scene. Data from Kimberly BOUCHER's phone showed no activity during the timeframe of this incident.

On or about November 6, 2024, in the State of Colorado, Adrian GRIGG, unlawfully, feloniously, and knowingly broke an entrance into, entered, or remained unlawfully after a lawful or unlawful entry in the occupied structure or building being

used for the operation of a commercial business of Champion Cleaners, located at 510 Zang St, Broomfield, CO, with the intent to commit therein the crime of Theft; in violation of section 18-4-203(1),(2)(a), C.R.S.

The offense alleged in Count Seventy-One was committed in the following manner:

On or about November 6th, 2024, around 0137 hours, surveillance footage showed an individual enter Champion Cleaners, located at 520 Zang St, Broomfield, Broomfield County, Colorado, after normal business hours. Based on the footage, two suspects shattered the front glass door to the business. One of the suspects entered the business, walked to the cash register, grabbed it, and left the business. Both suspects were wearing dark colored hoodies, sweatpants, masks and gloves. The suspect who entered the business was wearing a backpack similar to the one recovered in the search of GRIGG's Honda CRV. It cost \$1,370.54 to replace the glass door and \$120 was taken from the business. One of the individuals captured on the surveillance footage matched the general physical description of Adrian GRIGG.

Data from Adrian GRIGG's phone, during the timeframe of this incident, showed activity in the areas of Broomfield and northern Thornton, Colorado. The device's activity does not show in the area of this incident. Data from Kimberly BOUCHER's phone showed no activity during the timeframe of this incident.

On or about November 6, 2024, in the State of Colorado, Adrian GRIGG, unlawfully, feloniously, and knowingly broke an entrance into, entered, or remained unlawfully after a lawful or unlawful entry in the occupied structure or building being used for the operation of a commercial business of Yo Nutz, located at 1975 W. 120th Ave, Westminster, CO, with the intent to commit therein the crime of Theft; in violation of section 18-4-203(1),(2)(a), C.R.S.

The offense alleged in Count Seventy-Two was committed in the following manner:

On or about November 6th, 2024, around 0445 hours, surveillance footage showed an individual entering Yo Nutz, located at 1975 W 120th Ave, Westminster, Adams County, Colorado, after normal business hours. Footage showed the suspect entered the business by damaging the glass front door to the business. The suspect was wearing a high-visibility vest, a hoodie with the hood up, pants and blue and white Etnies shoes. The suspect took the cash register and exited the business. The cash register contained \$200, and the register itself was worth \$500. The cost to fix the front door was \$1,500. The individual captured on the surveillance footage matched the general physical description of Adrian GRIGG. Moreover, the suspect

was seen wearing similar clothing on surveillance to clothing recovered during a later search of GRIGG's 2002 Honda CRV.

Data from Adrian GRIGG's phone during the timeframe of this incident connected to a cellular tower near 136th Avenue and I-25. Data from Kimberly BOUCHER's phone showed no activity during the timeframe of this incident.

On or about November 7, 2024, in the State of Colorado, Adrian GRIGG, unlawfully, feloniously, and knowingly broke an entrance into, entered, or remained unlawfully after a lawful or unlawful entry in the occupied structure or building being used for the operation of a commercial business of Jewel of India Restaurant and Bar, located at 10343 N. Federal Blvd, Westminster, CO, with the intent to commit therein the crime of Theft; in violation of section 18-4-203(1),(2)(a), C.R.S.

The offense alleged in Count Seventy-Three was committed in the following manner:

On or about November 7th, 2024, surveillance footage showed an individual entering the Jewel of India Restaurant and Bar, located at 10343 N Federal Blvd, Westminster, Adams County, Colorado, after normal business hours. Footage showed the suspect gained entry by shattering the business's side glass door. The suspect entered the building and took the cash register from the front door area. The cash register contained approximately \$300 in cash/coin and several blank checks for the restaurant. The cash register had been purchased the previous year for \$1,200. The suspect was wearing a black hoodie and gloves as well as blue and white Etnies sneakers. Similar clothing was recovered during a later search of GRIGG's 2002 Honda CRV. The suspect was inside the business for less than 10 seconds. It cost \$3,175 to fix the damaged door. The individual captured on the surveillance footage matched the general physical description of Adrian GRIGG.

Data from Adrian GRIGG's phone during the timeframe of this incident showed activity consistent with the device being at his known encampment near W 116th Avenue and Pecos Street. Data from Kimberly BOUCHER's phone showed no activity during the timeframe of this incident. However, phone records indicate that BOUCHER's device searched Jewel of India's address using Google Maps.

SECOND DEGREE BURGLARY
C.R.S. § 18-4-203(1)(2)(A) F-4

On or about November 7, 2024, in the State of Colorado, Adrian GRIGG, unlawfully, feloniously, and knowingly broke an entrance into, entered, or remained unlawfully after a lawful or unlawful entry in the occupied structure or building being used for the operation of a commercial business of Oslo Apartments, located at 11501 Washington St, Northglenn, CO, with the intent to commit therein the crime of Theft; in violation of section 18-4-203(1),(2)(a), C.R.S.

The offense alleged in Count Seventy-Four was committed in the following manner:

On or about November 7th, 2024, around 0300 hours, an individual entered the tool shed to the Oslo Apartments, located at 11501 Washington St, Northglenn, Adams County, Colorado, without authorization. Footage showed a dark colored SUV consistent with a Honda CRV arriving at the apartment building sometime between 0200-0300 hours. The suspect damaged a padlock to the Oslo apartments' maintenance shed and took a large number of tools. The surveillance camera did not capture the individual who entered the shed. The total value of the tools taken was \$7,000 and the damage to the lock for the shed was \$20. The individual captured on the surveillance footage matched the general physical description of Adrian GRIGG. Moreover, the suspect was seen wearing similar clothing on surveillance to clothing recovered during a later search of GRIGG's 2002 Honda CRV.

After the incident, William HOGGE and Adrian GRIGG pawned several of the aforementioned tools at various pawn shops.

Data from Adrian GRIGG's phone during the timeframe of this incident showed activity consistent with both the known encampment near W 116th Avenue and Pecos Street, as well as the location of this incident. It should be noted that GRIGG's device connected to a cellular tower closer to the location of this incident rather than to the known encampment. Data from Kimberly BOUCHER's phone, during the time of this incident showed GPS locations within the immediate area of where this incident occurred.

On or about November 7, 2024, in the State of Colorado, Adrian GRIGG, unlawfully, feloniously, and knowingly broke an entrance into, entered, or remained unlawfully after a lawful or unlawful entry in the occupied structure or building being used for the operation of a commercial business of Sunshine Nails, located at 11455 Washington St, Northglenn, CO, with the intent to commit therein the crime of Theft; in violation of section 18-4-203(1),(2)(a), C.R.S.

The offense alleged in Count Seventy-Five was committed in the following manner:

On or about November 7th, 2024, around 0333 hours, surveillance footage showed an individual entering Sunshine Nails, located at 11445 Washington St, Northglenn, Adams County, Colorado, after normal business hours. Footage showed the suspect creating a small hole in the window next to the front door. The suspect reached in through the hole and pulled the cash register down to the floor. The suspect opened the register; however, there was no money inside the register. The damaged window was valued at \$500. The suspect was wearing a black hoodie and dark pants and black and white shoes. This incident occurred approximately 30 minutes after the incident at the tool shed of the Oslo Apartments (Count #74), and the incident locations for both are in the same vicinity. The individual captured on the surveillance footage matched the general physical description of Adrian GRIGG.

Data from Adrian GRIGG's phone during the timeframe of this incident showed activity consistent with both the known encampment near W 116th Avenue and Pecos Street, as well as the location of this incident. However, GRIGG's device connected to a cellular tower located closer to the location of this incident rather than to the known encampment. Data from Kimberly BOUCHER's phone, during the time of this incident, showed GPS locations within the immediate area of where this incident occurred.

The offense alleged in Count Seventy-Six was committed in the following manner:

On or about November 7th, 2024, around 0335 hours, surveillance footage showed an individual entering Empanada Espresso, located at 11461 Washington St, Northglenn, Adams County, Colorado, after normal business hours. Footage showed the suspect damaged the drive thru-window, reached through that space and opened the cash register. Nothing was taken from the register. The suspect was wearing a black hoodie and dark pants and black and white shoes, similar to the suspect's clothing observed on surveillance footage from the incident at Sunshine Nails (Count #75), which occurred earlier the same night. It cost \$700 to replace the damaged window. The individual captured on the surveillance footage matched the general physical description of Adrian GRIGG.

Data from Adrian GRIGG's phone during the timeframe of this incident showed activity consistent with both the known encampment near W 116th Avenue and Pecos Street, as well as the location of this incident. However, GRIGG's device connected to a cellular tower located closer to the location of this incident rather than to the known encampment. Data from Kimberly BOUCHER's phone, during the time of this incident, showed GPS locations within the immediate area of where this crime occurred.

On or about November 12, 2024, in the State of Colorado, Adrian GRIGG, unlawfully, feloniously, and knowingly broke an entrance into, entered, or remained unlawfully after a lawful or unlawful entry in the occupied structure or building being used for the operation of a commercial business of Sheridan Cafe, located at 5055 W. 72nd Ave, Unit I, Westminster, CO, with the intent to commit therein the crime of Theft; in violation of section 18-4-203(1),(2)(a), C.R.S.

The offense alleged in Count Seventy-Seven was committed in the following manner:

On or about November 12th, 2024, around 0229 hours, surveillance footage showed an individual enter the Sheridan Café, located at 5055 W 72nd Ave Unit I, Westminster, Adams County, Colorado, after normal business hours. Footage showed the suspect damaged the glass front door to the business. The suspect was wearing a mask, a black hoodie and grey pants. The suspect entered the store at 0218 hours, which was also the time the alarm company first received an alert. As the suspect approached the register, the audible interior alarm sounded and the suspect left without taking anything. A Google search showed the cost to replace the glass would be around \$250. The individual captured on the surveillance footage matched the general physical description of Adrian GRIGG. Moreover, the suspect was seen wearing similar clothing on surveillance to clothing recovered during a later search of GRIGG's 2002 Honda CRV.

Data from Adrian GRIGG's phone during the timeframe of this incident showed activity consistent with the known encampment near W 116th Avenue and Pecos Street. Data from Kimberly BOUCHER's phone during the time of this incident, showed GPS locations in the areas of Arvada, southern Westminster, and western Westminster, Colorado. The GPS locations in southern Westminster show in the general location of where the incident occurred. Cell phone location data from Kimberly BOUCHER's device places BOUCHER in the area at the time of the burglary.

On or about November 14, 2024, in the State of Colorado, Adrian GRIGG, unlawfully, feloniously, and knowingly broke an entrance into, entered, or remained unlawfully after a lawful or unlawful entry in the occupied structure or building being used for the operation of a commercial business of Flights Wine Cafe, located at 7714 Grandview Ave, Arvada, CO, with the intent to commit therein the crime of Theft; in violation of section 18-4-203(1),(2)(a), C.R.S.

The offense alleged in Count Seventy-Eight was committed in the following manner:

On or about November 14th, 2024, around 0133 hours, surveillance footage showed an individual entering Flights Wine Cafe, located at 7714 Grandview Ave, Arvada, Jefferson County, Colorado, after normal business hours. The suspect shattered the glass front door of the business. The suspect entered the business and took the cash register. There was \$200 taken from the register, and the drawer cost \$30. The total amount taken was \$230. It was estimated to cost \$500 to fix the door. The suspect was wearing a black hoodie with dark jeans, a white undershirt, black and white shoes. The cash register was later located near W. 55th and Otis St, in Arvada, which is approximately one mile away from Flights Wine Cafe. The individual captured on the surveillance footage matched the general physical description of Adrian GRIGG. Moreover, the suspect was seen wearing similar clothing on surveillance to clothing recovered during a later search of GRIGG's 2002 Honda CRV.

Data from Adrian GRIGG's phone showed no activity during the timeframe of this incident. Data from Kimberly BOUCHER's phone showed both cellular site activity and GPS activity. BOUCHER's phone connected to a cellular tower in the general area of where this incident occurred during the time of the burglary. GPS location data for BOUCHER's device showed the immediate areas of where this incident occurred, as well as the location of where the cash register was located and recovered. Cell phone location data from Kimberly BOUCHER's device places BOUCHER in the area at the time of the burglary.

Ave, Broomfield, CO, with the intent to commit therein the crime of Theft; in violation of section 18-4-203(1),(2)(a), C.R.S.

The offense alleged in Count Seventy-Nine was committed in the following manner:

On or about November 17th, 2024, around 0400 hours, surveillance footage showed an individual entering Scooter's Coffee, located at 1951 W. 5th Ave, Broomfield, Broomfield County, Colorado, after normal business hours. The suspect shattered the glass drive-thru window on the east side of the business to make entry. The suspect entered the business and opened the cash register, taking \$300 in cash. The damage to the drive-thru window was \$500. Surveillance footage shows the suspect was wearing a black sweatshirt and black pants. The suspect was wearing black and white shoes, which are similar to shoes found during the search of the Honda CRV. The individual captured on the surveillance footage matched the general physical description of Adrian GRIGG.

Data from Adrian GRIGG's phone during the timeframe of this incident showed activity in the areas of western Westminster and northern Arvada, Colorado. Data from Kimberly BOUCHER's phone during the timeframe of this incident showed activity across Northglenn, Thornton, and Westminster, Colorado. GPS location data for BOUCHER shows a likely pattern of movement along W 92nd Avenue through Westminster. The data from both Adrian GRIGG's and Kimberly BOUCHER's phones is not consistent with the location of where this incident occurred.

On or about November 18, 2024, in the State of Colorado, Adrian GRIGG, unlawfully, feloniously, and knowingly broke an entrance into, entered, or remained unlawfully after a lawful or unlawful entry in the occupied structure or building being used for the operation of a commercial business of Pet Wants Arvada, located at 7674 Grandview Ave #100, Arvada, CO, with the intent to commit therein the crime of Theft; in violation of section 18-4-203(1),(2)(a), C.R.S.

The offense alleged in Count Eighty was committed in the following manner:

On or about November 18th, 2024, around 0230 hours, surveillance footage showed an individual entering Pet Wants Arvada, located at 7674 Grandview Ave #100, Arvada, Jefferson County, Colorado, after normal business hours. Footage showed the suspect arrived at the business and damaged a small window on the south side of the building. The suspect then entered the building and took the cashbox before leaving the business. The cashbox had \$300 in cash and the box was valued at

\$200. The total amount taken was \$500. It cost \$2,000.89 to replace the damaged window. The suspect was wearing a hoodie, beanie, and gloves. The individual captured on the surveillance footage matched the general physical description of Adrian GRIGG. Moreover, the suspect was seen wearing similar clothing on surveillance to clothing recovered during a later search of GRIGG's 2002 Honda CRV.

Data from Adrian GRIGG's phone shows no activity during the timeframe of this incident. Data from Kimberly BOUCHER's phone during the timeframe of this incident shows GPS locations in the immediate vicinity of where this incident occurred.

COUNT EIGHTY-ONE
SECOND DEGREE BURGLARY
C.R.S. § 18-4-203(1)(2)(A) F-4

On or about November 18, 2024, in the State of Colorado, Adrian GRIGG, unlawfully, feloniously, and knowingly broke an entrance into, entered, or remained unlawfully after a lawful or unlawful entry in the occupied structure or building being used for the operation of a commercial business of Burd's Nest Gallery, located at 7611 Grandview Ave, Arvada, CO, with the intent to commit therein the crime of Theft; in violation of section 18-4-203(1),(2)(a), C.R.S.

The offense alleged in Count Eighty-One was committed in the following manner:

On or about November 18th, 2024, around 0230 hours, surveillance footage showed an individual entering Burd's Nest Gallery, located at 7611 Grandview Ave, Arvada, Jefferson County, Colorado, after normal business hours. Footage showed the suspect arrived at the business and damaged the business's lockbox. The suspect then entered the building using a key from the lockbox. The suspect took the business's cashbox and left. The cashbox contained \$200, and it cost around \$1,500 to replace the lockbox and to re-key the business. The suspect was wearing a hoodie, beanie, and gloves. This is similar to the suspect's clothing from Count #80 (Pet Wants Arvada), which is located in the same complex and was burglarized on the same night at nearly the same time. The individual captured on the surveillance footage matched the general physical description of Adrian GRIGG. Moreover, the suspect was seen wearing similar clothing on surveillance to clothing recovered during a later search of GRIGG's 2002 Honda CRV.

Data from Adrian GRIGG's phone shows no activity during the timeframe of this incident. Data from Kimberly BOUCHER's phone during the timeframe of this incident shows GPS location data in the immediate vicinity of where this incident occurred.

COUNT 82

THEFT

The total amount stolen from all incidents was approximately \$41,000.00.

ADRIAN GRIGGS NOVEMBER INTERVIEW:

On November 18th, 2024, law enforcement located Adrian GRIGG's Honda CRV near a Chick-Fil-A in the Thornton area. Officers observed Adrian GRIGG, Justin CRUM and Jacqueline NEUMANN. Adrian GRIGG and Kimberly BOUCHER were in their 2002 Honda CRV. Justin CRUM and Jacqueline NEUMANN were in Jacqueline NEUMANN's 2007 blue Honda Civic. Det. Coleman recognized both the Honda CRV and the Honda Civic from video surveillance collected during this investigation.

Officers observed Adrian GRIGG and Justin CRUM enter the Big 5 Sporting Goods (now closed) around 1343 hour. Officers contacted Adrian GRIGG and arrested him without incident. Adrian GRIGG was observed wearing a hoodie, beanie and gloves, similar to the suspect's clothing in Counts 80 and 81.

Law enforcement placed the Honda CRV on a police hold and had it towed.

SEARCH OF GRIGG'S 2002 HONDA CRV:

On November 21st, 2024, detectives obtained and executed a search warrant for the 2002 blue Honda CRV. The following items were located in the Honda CRV:

Front Passenger Seat:

- Drill
- Personal items

Rear Passenger Seat:

- Two-way radio
- Window punch
- Tools
- Yellow bolt cutters

Trunk/Cargo Area:

- Two-way radio
- Large bag full of power tools
- Drone
- Scooter
- Lots of tools
- Bag containing black clothing
- Yellow crowbar
- Black crowbar
- High-visibility vest
- Tub full of clothing and black backpack
- Black bolt cutters (used in Count 68)

Other items located in the vehicle:

- Blue/White Etnies shoes
- Black/White shoes and bandana

GRIGG'S ADAMS COUNTY JAIL PHONE CALLS

Detectives requested GRIGG's jail calls from the Adams County Jail. Detectives noted the following from phone calls between Adrian GRIGG and Kimberly BOUCHER and Justin CRUM. The time frame of the jail calls is between November 24th, 2024, to December 13, 2024. Further jail calls were obtained for the timeframe of December 5, 2024, to December 13, 2024.

- On November 24, 2024, at 1528, Adrian GRIGG and Kimberly Boucher discuss "sitting on money" and needing to get rid of it. They further discuss a trailer, bikes, and selling property.

- On November 24, 2024, at 1600, Adrian GRIGG and Justin CRUM discuss a generator and the trailer.
- On November 24, 2024, at 1647, GRIGG and BOUCHER discuss the previous conversation GRIGG had with CRUM. GRIGG provides BOUCHER the code to his storage unit. William “David” HOGGE is then put on speakerphone with BOUCHER, they mention placing additional locks on the trailer.
- On November 25, 2024, at 1536, GRIGG and Boucher discuss taking a generator to the pawn shop “Cash 4 U” in Federal Heights.
- On December 3, 2024, at 2158, GRIGG and BOUCHER discussed GRIGG riding a green bicycle in Lafayette, and that Det. Coleman knew GRIGG was riding the bicycle. BOUCHER tells GRIGG they are not running from this and that GRIGG must deal with this. GRIGG and BOUCHER discuss what evidence the police have like the trailer and the car.
- On December 9, 2024, GRIGG and BOUCHER discuss GRIGG’s pending case, stating the police have nothing, and that GRIGG wasn’t there because GRIGG was with BOUCHER, so the police have the wrong person.

ADRIAN GRIGG’S INTERVIEW AT THE ADAMS COUNTY JAIL:

On January 21st, 2025, Detectives Coleman and Lanning went to the Adams County Jail to speak with Adrian GRIGG. Adrian GRIGG was given a Miranda Warning and agreed to speak with the detectives.

During the interview, Adrian GRIGG disclosed his association with several individuals. Those individuals included Justin CRUM, Jacqueline NEUMANN, and William "David" HOGGE. Adrian GRIGG stated that he met Justin CRUM and Jacqueline NEUMANN through Kimberly BOUCHER. Adrian GRIGG described Justin CRUM as tall and noted that he often rode in the passenger seat of Jacqueline NEUMANN’s vehicle, the blue Honda Civic. Adrian GRIGG also mentioned that Justin CRUM and Jacqueline NEUMANN would often leave items, including tools, blankets, and backpacks, in his and Kimberly BOUCHER's vehicle due to their own car's inability to lock.

Adrian GRIGG also identified other individuals, such as "Ditch" and Steven STOUT, who were part of the group but had less direct involvement in the incidents discussed. He described "Ditch" as a transient figure who would occasionally join the group. [REDACTED]

Adrian GRIGG expressed uncertainty about specific incidents, stating that he could not recall being in certain locations or participating in any burglaries. He

mentioned that Justin CRUM and Jacqueline NEUMANN would often leave at night and return with money, but he was unsure of their activities during those times. Adrian GRIGG stated that he and Kimberly BOUCHER would occasionally park their car and smoke methamphetamine in various locations, which could explain their presence in certain areas.

KIMBERLY BOUCHER'S INTERVIEW:

On January 23rd, 2025, Detectives Coleman and Lanning met with Kimberly BOUCHER in an interview room at the Westminster Police Department.

Kimberly BOUCHER confirmed that Adrian GRIGG was her husband and that William "David" HOGGE, Jacqueline NEUMANN, and Justin CRUM were some of their associates. Kimberly BOUCHER described a pattern of manipulation and exploitation by these individuals, who she claimed used her and her husband, Adrian GRIGG, for his skills and resources. Kimberly BOUCHER explained that Adrian GRIGG had "a particular set of skills," pertaining to committing burglaries. According to BOUCHER, Adrian GRIGG was good at identifying businesses that would have cash in the register. When committing the burglary, Adrian GRIGG would try to enter by causing the least amount of damage possible. Although these incidents started small and were infrequent, they became more frequent over time to acquire more money. Kimberly BOUCHER explained that Adrian GRIGG initially took care to minimize damage during burglaries, such as targeting lockboxes and avoiding unnecessary destruction. However, under William "David" HOGGE's influence, the frequency and recklessness of the burglaries increased, with multiple locations being targeted in a single night. Kimberly BOUCHER explained that William "David" HOGGE would provide "clear" or methamphetamine to Adrian GRIGG. In return, Adrian GRIGG was required to commit several burglaries a night.

When they began living at the encampment near Pecos in February 2024, Kimberly BOUCHER and Adrian GRIGG shared a phone. They continued to share this phone until Adrian GRIGG was able to purchase his own phone around August 2024.

Kimberly described several specific incidents involving burglaries committed by GRIGG:

1. **Jersey Mike's:** Kimberly BOUCHER explained that Adrian GRIGG's first burglary was at Jersey Mike's (Count #1, February 21, 2024, at 0420). After this burglary, others in the camp wanted Adrian GRIGG to teach them how he committed the burglary. Adrian and another male broke into Jersey Mike's again (Count #3, March 18, 2024, at 0348). Adrian GRIGG informed Kimberly BOUCHER that the burglary was a mess and that GRIGG wanted to continue

his actions on his own. Adrian GRIGG then continued to burglarize many other businesses as the months went on.

2. **Scalzotto's:** A particular burglary Kimberly BOUCHER mentioned was Scalzotto's Italian Restaurant (Count #27, June 18, 2024, at 0457). Kimberly BOUCHER said that Adrian GRIGG returned to camp with a safe that night. Inside the safe was some cash and several credit cards. Kimberly BOUCHER thought it was weird that the safe had many credit cards and believed the owner was scamming customers. A safe was taken from Scalzotto's Italian Restaurant during this burglary.
3. **Crumb Cookie:** Kimberly BOUCHER stated that Adrian GRIGG and Steve STOUT targeted a Crumb Cookies location near the Thornton Police Department, taking a safe. She noted that Steve STOUT abandoned the safe during transport, due to perceived police activity. When they returned to camp, Steve STOUT pleaded with Adrian GRIGG to go back and get the safe. This led to a falling out between Adrian GRIGG and Steve STOUT. This likely refers to Count # 31 (Crumble Cookie, June 24, 2024, at 0448).

BOUCHER advised that she did not go with GRIGG when he went out to commit a burglary. She would remain at the camp. In September 2024, Kimberly BOUCHER and Adrian GRIGG purchased the Honda CRV, and BOUCHER would go with Adrian GRIGG when he was committing burglaries.

Based on the information above, probable cause exists for numerous counts against Adrian GRIGG
